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RENOVATION IMPROVEMENTS TO SOUTH HURON HOSPITAL

Exeter, ON – South Huron Hospital Association (SHHA) will be undergoing three renovation projects in the upcoming weeks; improvements to the kitchen area, front entrance/lobby area redesign and improvements to the Inpatient Nursing Station.

Improvements to the kitchen area will include tearing out and replacing the existing kitchen floor as well as improvements to the overall workspace. SHHA was successful in securing one time exceptional circumstances under the Government's Health Infrastructure Fund (HIRF) in the amount of \$41,000 for this project. The HIRF provides funds to supplement a hospital's existing capital renewal program and help address renewal needs on a priority basis.

The front entrance/lobby area redesign is as a result of the need to:

- improve accessibility
- create a dedicated waiting area for emergency patients
- improve privacy and confidentiality
- streamline circulation and flow
- accessible public washroom
- improve infection control

In addition, it was identified that the inpatient nursing station also required modifications to improve access, improve confidentiality and to eliminate congestion in the area.

SHHA is extremely fortunate to receive funding for both projects from the South Huron Hospital Foundation (SHHF) in the amount of \$239,000. Without their assistance, neither project could move ahead.
